Deity and Lordship of Christ

The deity of Christ is one of the most critical principles of Christian faith. Our salvation is based upon the fact that according to God's promises in the Old Testament, He came to earth, like a loving Father, to seek and save us, His lost children.

We must always be aware not to exalt any human to God's level. It is stated in the Bible that man did not become God, but rather God appeared in human flesh. The question is not whether God can become man (of course He can). The key question is why did He do it? (John 1:29)

Different titles of Jesus and their meanings:

Therefore when Christ was on earth he was 100% God and 100% man.

1) The deity of Christ is described in the Old Testament

The following verses, as well as many other verses, state that God is the Savior and **He will be coming to earth.**

- a) Isaiah 25:9 Surely this is our God. We trusted Him and He saved us.
- **b)** Isaiah 40:10-11 The Sovereign Lord comes. He gathers the lambs in His arms.
- c) Isaiah 7:14 He will be born to a virgin and His name will be Immanuel, which means God with us.
- **d) Isaiah 9:6** *The child who is born will be called "Mighty God" and "Everlasting Father".*
- e) Malachi 3:1 The Lord you are seeking will come to His temple.

2) The New Testament declare Jesus as God

The following verses as well as many others introduce Jesus Christ as God.

- a) John 1:1, 14, 29 The Word was with God and the Word was God. The word Became flesh and made His dwelling among us. The lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.
- **b)** 1 Tim. 3:16 The mystery of godliness was revealed: God appeared in a body.

[&]quot;Son of God" means God in flesh.

[&]quot;Son of Man" means God in flesh.

[&]quot;Jesus" means God the Savior.

[&]quot;Messiah" means anointed as King.

c) Col. 1:15-19 Christ is the image of the invisible God. By Him all things were created. He is before all things, God's fullness dwells in Him.

3) Jesus Christ Himself declared that He is God

- **a) John 10:30-33** *Jesus said "I and the Father are one" and because of that the Jews wanted to stone Him for blasphemy.*
- **b)** John 14:6-11 "If you really knew me you would know my Father as well. Because anyone who has seen me has seen the Father, believe I am in the Father and the Father is in me, it is the Father living in me who is doing His work".

4) Jesus Christ proves He is God with His deeds

- 1) Creation of the world
- 2) Resurrecting the dead
- 3) Healing the blind
- 4) Commanding nature and silencing the storm
- 5) Forgiving sins
- 6) Accepting worship

In prayer talk to Jesus as God. Worship Him as God and tell Him that you want to know Him and to have an intimate and loving relationship with Him.
